- In order to participate in this event, your Team Roster(s) and Coaches need to register on the NCAA website. Coaches who are not certified by the NCAA will not be allowed to sit on the bench.

- DATES:** JULY 20TH – JULY 23RD, 2017
- FACILITIES:** Cashman Center – 850 Las Vegas Blvd North Las Vegas NV 89101
- ENTRY FEE:** Early Bird Entry Fee (Before April 15, 2017) \$545.00
After April 15, 2017 \$645.00
*Once a team enters the tournament refunds will not be given.
- ENTRY DEADLINE:** All materials must be **RECEIVED** via Online Registration by **WEDNESDAY, JUNE 28th, 2017**.
All participating teams must have a roster submitted online at www.aauboysbasketball.org
Entry fees must be submitted via Online Roster System.
- SPECTATOR ADMISSION:** Daily admission will be available for \$15.00 per adult, \$8.00 per youth (ages 7-18) and Seniors (ages 55 and older). Under 6, free. A Length of Event pass will also be available for \$40.00 per adult, \$25.00 youth (ages 7-18) and Seniors (ages 55 and older)
- OPENING CEREMONY:** No Opening Ceremony will be held.
- REGISTRATION:** **WEDNESDAY, JULY 19TH, 2017 between 6:00 pm - 9:00 pm at Cashman Center** in Las Vegas, NV.
ALL COACHES AND PLAYERS REGISTRATION
THURSDAY, JULY 20TH, 2017. Time TBD at Cashman Center
- COACH VERIFICATION:** All bench personnel must be present and show government issued photo ID in order to receive credentials. NO EXCEPTIONS
- ELIGIBLE TEAMS:** Teams that hold current AAU Membership are eligible to compete in the Super Showcase
- RULES OF PLAY:** The Super Showcase will be played under the 2016-2017 National Federation of State High School Association rules, except where amended by the Las Vegas Showcase Committee. We will be using a 30 second shot clock. Please visit www.lvshowcase.com and click on the Rules/Eligibility tab for more information
- SCHEDULES/RESULTS:** Schedules and Results will be posted at www.lvshowcase.com and will be emailed to each team that provides a valid email address in the Online Roster System.
- GAME FORMAT:** Four (4) 8 minute quarters – 5-minute halftime/warm-up – 4-minute overtime.
- TOURNAMENT FORMAT:** July 19 – Registration

BENCH RULES:

The home team will sit on the left side of the official scorekeeper, facing the table from the floor. A team may have on its bench only eligible players in uniform and four non-players. Violation of this rule shall result in a two shot technical foul. The violator will be removed from the bench. **At least one-person age 18 or older must be on the bench at all times.**

ROSTER:

All athletes and non-athletes allowed on the bench must hold a current AAU membership. Additions must be made by the entry deadline date of the event. The total number of players designated to play in the Super Showcase may not exceed fifteen (15) players.

GRADE DETERMINATION:

14U/8th Grade - An athlete can be no older than 14 on August 31, 2017. Grade Exception: An athlete who is in the 8th grade as of October 1, 2016 and who is no older than 15 on August 31, 2017 is eligible to play in the 14U/8th grade division.

15U/9th Grade - An athlete can be no older than 15 on August 31, 2017. Grade Exception: An athlete who is in the 9th grade as of October 1, 2016 and who is no older than 16 on August 31, 2017 is eligible to play in the 15U/9th grade division.

16U/10th Grade - An athlete can be no older than 16 on August 31, 2017. Grade Exception: An athlete who is in the 10th grade as of October 1, 2016 and who is no older than 17 on August 31, 2017 is eligible to play in the 16U/10th grade division.

17U/11th Grade - An athlete can be no older than 17 on August 31, 2017. Grade Exception: An athlete who is in the 11th grade as of October 1, 2016 and who is no older than 18 on August 31, 2017 is eligible to play in the 17U/11th grade division.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any questions pertaining to the eligibility of a player or team shall be directed to the Tournament Director or his/her designee in attendance.

TEAM DOCUMENTATION:

Each team **MUST** present "**ELIGIBILITY MATERIALS**" for review. The "**ELIGIBILITY MATERIALS**" must contain:

1. Copy of the team AAU Online Roster to be used at the event.
2. Copy of each athlete's Proof of Age.
3. Copy of athlete's Proof of Grade. (Only if they are an exception).

The "**ELIGIBILITY MATERIALS**" must be in your possession at all times. Failure to have proper documentation during the event may result in athlete or team disqualification. Acceptable documents can be found at www.aauboybasketball.org in the Rule Book.

PROTESTS:

For Super Showcase play, any eligibility protest that is turned in the first day of competition by 6:00 pm will be reviewed by the eligibility committee, and a decision will be made prior to bracket play. Any eligibility protest that comes after the first day of competition will be reviewed at the Eligibility Committee's discretion. All non-eligibility protests will be reviewed by the Eligibility Committee at their discretion.

A fee of \$100.00 cash (refunded if protest is upheld) must accompany all protests. Protests must come from a non-athlete member listed on the official online roster for the event. The **written** protest must be submitted to the National Commissioner-in-Charge. All decisions of the Eligibility Committee shall be final.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

Players', coaches' and spectators' conduct should be above reproach, on and off the court. Misbehavior or misconduct may result in disqualification from the tournament. Coaches listed on the official team roster are responsible for the conduct of their players and any damages incurred to the hotel or facilities used by the players. If a coach or a player is suspended during a game, the suspension does NOT include forfeited games. The suspension will be for the next game played

MISBEHAVIOR/EJECTIONS

1. Any coach ejected for fighting will be ineligible for the remainder of the tournament.
2. Players ejected for fighting are ineligible to participate in the team's next game. Additional penalties, up to exclusion from the tournament, may be imposed by the National Eligibility Committee.
3. If a coach or player is ejected from a game for unsportsmanlike behavior (not fighting), he/she will be ineligible to participate in the next scheduled game. The head coach may appeal the penalty by submitting a written request for appeal to the Tournament Headquarters within two (2) hours of the conclusion of the game. A Commissioner shall consider the appeal. The Commissioners ruling is final.
4. If a coach or player is ejected a second time, he/she will be ineligible for the remainder of the tournament.
5. Coaches or Players who leave the bench to engage athletes or coaches on the playing floor may be suspended by the National Eligibility Committee for any period up to the duration of the tournament.
6. The National Eligibility Committee may impose suspensions or other penalties for misbehavior which occurs at any time and at any location during the event.
7. Coaches and Athletes who engage in misbehavior are subject to additional disciplinary action from the AAU Boys' Basketball National Infractions Committee. Penalties may include suspension from AAU events in future years.

UNIFORM:

Players' jerseys must have numbers on both the front and back, numbers can be 00-99. Minimum size of numbers shall be 2" on the front and 4" on the back. The top/left team on the schedule shall be the home team and sit on the scorekeepers' left. The bottom/right team on the schedule shall be the visiting team and sit on the scorekeepers' right.

COACHES' ATTIRE:

All non-uniformed persons on the bench will be permitted to wear the following: Dress shorts, Slacks, Shirts with collars and sleeves, dress shoes or tennis shoes are permitted during play. Jean shorts sweat pants, athletic wear, tee shirts, hats, warm up suits and open-toed shoes are NOT PERMITTED. The dress code applies to female bench personnel as well. Women may wear dresses or skirts appropriate to the occasion.

COACHES EDUCATION:

The PCA Coaches Education Course is MANDATORY and FREE for all AAU Non-Athletes. Please visit www.aausports.org and click on PCA Button in order to enter and take the MANDATORY AAU/PCA coaches educational course. Membership may be revoked from Non-Athletes who do not complete course prior to competition.

WARM-UP & GAME BALLS:

Basketballs are provided during warm-up sessions. Spalding, the official ball of AAU Boys Basketball, shall provide basketballs for warm-ups and games. **DO NOT** bring basketballs to games.

HOTEL/MOTEL POLICY:

Upon approval by the National Sport Chair, a Super Showcase Host may designate certain hotel/motel properties not to be used by teams participating in a Super Showcase Event. The exact name and address of each property must be provided to the National Sport Chair. The AAU Boys Basketball Committee may reject entries of teams who reserve rooms in these designated properties. Once the Super Showcase Event begins, team(s) can be required to vacate the designated property in order to continue to participate in the event.

The AAU cannot and does not guarantee the appearance and/or participation of specific participant(s) and/or teams (as applicable) in this event. The AAU has licensed (approved) this Event as an official AAU Event (competition), but the AAU is not and shall not be responsible for any participant's or spectator's expenses related to this Event (nor reimbursements for same) in case of dissatisfaction of any participant, friend, family, or spectator, this includes, but is not limited to all travel, hotel (lodging), food, entry fees and/or any other expenses related to the event.
